## HONOR FLIGHT


For Our World War II Veterans

The purpose of **Honor Flight** is to fly disadvantaged, World War II veterans from Clark County to Washington D.C. to visit those Memorials dedicated to honor their sacrifices. The program was conceived by Earl Morse, a Physician Assistant and retired Air Force Captain, to honor veterans he has taken care of for the past 27 years. Earl asked one man, a World War II veteran from Springfield, Ohio if he had ever seen his memorial in Washington D.C. That man broke down and cried. He said at his age and position in life he would probably never get to his memorial. It was dedicated in 2004 for a generation that the youngest member is 76 years old. A man's average life expectancy is 74.5. Where does that leave us? Sadly, time is not on our side.

On Saturday, May 21st, 2005 seven small, light airplanes departed the Springfield-Beckley Municipal Airport at 7:30 am. On board was a pilot, co-pilot and one or two WWII veterans; the men known as "The Greatest Generation". They flew to D.C., rented a van and then traveled to their Memorial and finally...after 60 years of waiting they saw what was built to honor them. A memorial completed less than a year ago. They visited, they looked, they took photographs but most of all they reminisced and they finally saw the Memorial dedicated to their sacrifices. To view pictures of this trip [click here](#). On June 11th, if weather, bodies and funds hold out, another 6-8 small airplanes and another 12-15 World War II veterans will depart Springfield to fly to Washington D.C.

As of today, we are not receiving funding from the government or any corporations. We're operating from the goodness of many people's hearts. These people are pilots volunteering their plane, time and money to fly men they've never met to Washington D.C. These people are ordinary citizens dedicated to honoring our nations' veteran. These people are groups in the community who've collected money to help us. These people are people like you who want to help...in whatever way they can. We need to make this happen because in another 5-10 years these men will be gone, that's why this needs to happen.

The cost to the veteran is none. It will be completely free. The pilots who've volunteered to fly are paying for the \$400.00 to \$720.00 rental fee for the aircraft. We're still looking for donations for provide meals, transportation, scooters in D.C., fuel and other necessities.

# GOOD SAMARITAN LAWS

D.C. CODE ANN. § 7-401. Limitation on liability for medical care or assistance in emergency situations.

**(a)** Any person who in good faith renders emergency medical care or assistance to an injured person at the scene of an accident or other emergency in the District of Columbia outside of a hospital, without the expectation of receiving or intending to seek compensation from such injured person for such service, shall not be liable in civil damages for any act or omission, not constituting gross negligence, in the course of rendering such care or assistance.
