






Where did the generosity come from?





What does a grant proposal look like?






Items you will need to write a grant proposal

- IRS Determination Letter
- List of Board of Directors
- Cost Estimates
- Financials from Previous Fiscal Year (Audit, Review, or Compilation if available)
- Current Fiscal Year-To-Date Financials

Honor Flight Northeast Indiana respectfully requests \$5,000 from The Portland Foundation to help fund its 49th Honor Flight on October 16, 2024. On that day 85 armed service veterans and their guardians will fly from Fort Wayne to Washington, DC to visit the monuments and memorials built in their honor.

Honor Flight Northeast Indiana is submitting grant proposals to Indiana Community Foundations in Adams, Allen, Blackford, DeKalb, Elkhart, Fulton, Grant, Huntington, Jay, Kosciusko, LaGrange, Marshall, Miami, Noble, St Joseph, Steuben, Wabash, Wells, and Whitley Counties because the overwhelming majority of the 3,481 veterans who have gone on the first 45 Flights are residents of those counties.

It is Honor Flight Northeast Indiana's hope that all 19 of the Indiana Community Foundations award a grant so that the 49th Flight will be completely underwritten by Indiana Community Foundations.
